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## Spanish & Portuguese

*The Spanish and Portuguese section of the Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures offers courses of study leading to the M.A. and Ph.D. in Spanish with a concentration in literature, linguistics, or second language acquisition. The Department actively participates in interdisciplinary programs such as Comparative Literature, Linguistics, Women's Studies and African American Studies. Most graduate students receive teaching assistantships. Fellowships from the Purdue Research Foundation are available for dissertation research on a competitive basis.*

## Admissions

Applications are accepted to the Graduate Program at Purdue University throughout the year. Scores on the General Test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) are required for all US citizens and permanent residents. For international applicants who are non-native speakers of English, the results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) must be submitted to the Graduate School.

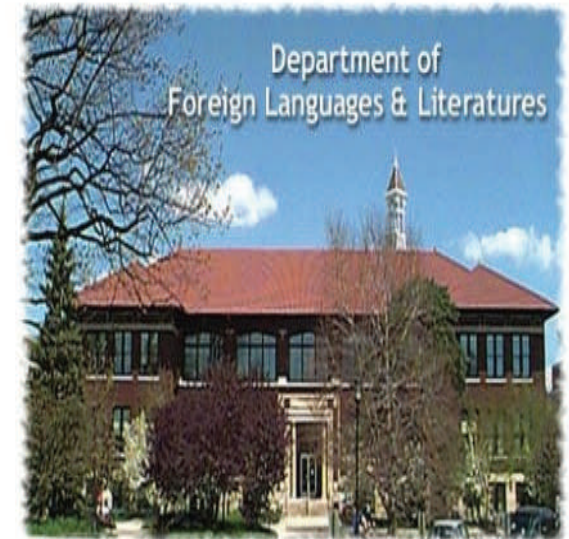
