Dr. Rodney Hero is Professor at the Charles and Louise Travers Department of Political Science at the University of California, Berkeley. Professor Hero's research and teaching focus on American democracy and politics, especially as viewed through the analytical lenses of Latino Politics, Racial/Ethnic Politics, State & Urban Politics, and Federalism. His book, *Latinos and the U.S. Political System: Two-tiered Pluralism*, received the American Political Science Association's [APSA] 1993 Ralph J. Bunche Award. He also authored *Faces of Inequality: Social Diversity in American Politics* (which was selected for the APSA's Woodrow Wilson Award in 1999), and *Racial Diversity and Social Capital: Equality and Community in America* (2007).
