Equity and Diversity

CLA is an important part of our campus's commitment to fostering greater diversity and inclusion: Our research and teaching consider issues related to racism, sexism and other forms of discrimination; our small classes invite discussion and critical dialogue; and our majors provide valuable disciplinary breadth that invite multiple forms of expression. As the Chief Diversity Officer for the university, how will you draw on this expertise and expand the capacity of the CLA (including its faculty and its students) to help Purdue create a more inclusive, supportive, and diverse campus community?

Non-Tenure Track Faculty

Hiring Issues

In our survey, faculty raised concerns about the prioritization of STEM-adjacent scholarship within the CLA—across hiring, research programs and curricular developments.
