SUBJECT: Reapportionment of Liberal Arts Senate for 2012-2013

In compliance with Section 2.02 of the Liberal Arts By-Laws, the Senate must determine the apportionment of elected senators to Liberal Arts departments each calendar year. The following is a proposed reapportionment for Senate consideration. If adopted, this representation would become effective on July 1, 2012.
