R. Stephen Warner is Professor of Sociology Emeritus at UIC, a past President of the Society for the Scientific Study of Religion and the Association for the Sociology of Religion, and past-chair of the ASA Religion Section. His widely influential article "Work in Progress Toward a New Paradigm for the Sociological Study of Religion in the United States" won the 1994 SSSR Distinguished Article Award. He is the author of *New Wine in Old Wineskins: Evangelicals and Liberals in a Small-Town Church* (1989 SSSR Distinguished Book Award) and *A Church of Our Own: Disestablishment and Diversity in American Religion* (2005). He led the first comparative research project on post-1965 immigrants and religion and co-edited *Gatherings in Diaspora: Religious Communities and New Immigration* (1998).

His current work includes a long-term project on "Race and Religion: U.S. vs. Europe," aspects of which has appeared as several articles in journals or chapters in edited volumes.
