**Keynote Address:** Marc Pilisuk Professor Emeritus, University of California and co-author of WHO BENEFITS FROM GLOBAL VIOLENCE AND WAR (broadcast electronically).

**Marc** Pilisuk earned his PhD in 1961 from the University of Michigan in Clinical and Social Psychology. A professor Emeritus at the University of California, Davis, he currently serves on the faculty at the San Francisco-based *Saybrook University Graduate School and Research Center* where he has taught extensively on conflict resolution, globalization, ecological psychology and sustainability. He is the founder of the first Teach-in ever, protesting the Vietnam War. Pilisuk is also a past President of the Society for the Study of Peace, Conflict and Violence.

While at Purdue University in the 1960's, Pilisuk worked with Robert Perrucci on a book *The Triple Revolution* which appeared in 1968 with an updated edition three years later. This text focused on technological militarism, the cybernetic revolution and the revolution in human rights. He moved on to UC Berkeley in 1967 where he taught in Psychology, Social Welfare, Community Mental Health, Peace and Conflict Studies and City and Regional Planning. He joined the faculty of UC Davis in 1977 where he taught for 15 years as Professor of Community Studies and chaired the Department of Applied Behavioral Sciences (renamed the Dept. of Human and Community Development in 1992). He is the author or editor of 7 books and over 140 publications and reviews on social psychology, conflict resolution, healing, self-concepts, and other topics.
