Anderson* (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 312 pp. We analyze critically the extensive but little-known writings on Iran's 1979 Islamic revolution by Michel Foucault, who traveled there in 1978. We also discuss the course of the Revolution, especially with regard to gender, and the heated debate over Foucault's Iran writings in France in 1978 and 1979. Additionally, we examine Foucault's post-1979 writings on sexuality in light of his Iran writings. In an appendix, we provide an annotated translation

of Foucault's writings and interviews on Iran and the critical responses to them by Middle East scholar Maxime Rodinson and Iranian and French feminists. Each author contributed equally to this book.

This is the first full-length study in a Western language of the achievements and limitations of Lenin's extensive writings on Hegel, as well as of their relation to his better-known work on imperialism, anti-colonial movements, and the state. It takes up as well the considerable influence of Lenin's writings

on Hegel on Western Marxists such as Georg Lukács, Henri Lefebvre, C. L. R. James, Raya Dunayevskaya, Lucio Colletti, and Louis Althusser. Ashley Passmore and I translated this new material from the German and I annotated it. Hudis and I also contributed a 25-page introduction. 5. Books in Progress

Kevin B. Anderson, "Multicultural Marx: Writing the Edges of Globalization" (sole-authored): In this book, I critically analyze a variety of extensive but neglected Marx texts dealing with the edges of Western capitalism. They take up colonialism, ethnicity and nationalism, and non-Western and pre-capitalist societies. These texts focus on India and China, the Civil War in the U.S., Ireland and Poland, as well as Latin America, Russia, Algeria, Indonesia, and other non-Western societies. At first, Marx exhibits a marked Eurocentrism as well as an implicitly unilinear concept of social development. Later, especially with the *Grundrisse* (1857-58), the French edition of *Capital*, and the largely unpublished 1879-82 notebooks, Marx's position can be seen to have evolved. His post-1857 texts exhibit a greater appreciation of the contributions of non-Western societies to world culture, as well as a more multilinear concept of development. The 1879-82 notebooks, to which I have access through the *Marx-Engels Gesamtausgabe* project (see below), also show an interest in gender relations across a wide variety of societies. This manuscript is under submission.

"Theoretical Wars Over the Middle East," by Janet Afary and Kevin B. Anderson. This book will discuss critically some influential Western theorists writing on the Middle Eastern/Muslim world, from Edward Said to Bernard Lewis, with a special emphasis on French theory, including the work of Maxime Rodinson and Henri Corbin. From another angle, this volume will examine critically some theoretical writings on Islam and Western modernity from within the region, both more Islamist authors like Ali Shariati and Sayyid Qutb, and more secular ones like Azar Nafisi and Akbar Ganji. This volume is in its beginning stages.
