
Our Events

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Summer Internship

The National Basketball Academy / Pacers Youth Basketball Camp

Over the summer, I interned for the National Basketball Academy, which is a 3rd party company that partners with the Indiana Pacers to be in charge of their Youth Basketball Program. I first located the internship at the Pacers Career Fair, where I had a brief conversation with the program director. After reaching out to him several times via email and a phone interview, I was fortunate enough to receive an offer. There were three different positions; Social Media, Fund Raising, and Basketball. My focus was a basketball coach and trainer. The main responsibilities were camp check-in, manage a different team each week, coach a specific skill, and alter my coaching style based on campers' age group. Also, along with other interns, I had my hand in on other assignments such as social media, fundraising, marketing, and call campaign.



After the camp, I would assist and conduct personal-trainings with the directors. Rather than addressing a large group of campers, I could swift my focus on teaching individuals with their basketball skills. Mainly, as a basketball coach, I learned to develop myself as an effective instructor

However, I also learned how to maintain my professionalism with campers' parents. By sending their children to the camp, the parents were putting their trust in the program and coaches. Thus, not only I had to provide the best camp experience as possible, but also I had to be attentive to any unexpected situations such as injuries. It was challenging to communicate with the parents because my responsibility was to protect the company's integrity and be mindful of the campers at the same time.
