WOMEN IN AMERICA SINCE 1870

This course surveys the history of women in the United States from 1870 to the present. Examining the social, political, and economic forces that have shaped that history, the course assesses the sources of change and continuity in all women's lives. We will consider the changing meanings and understandings of gender; the changing meanings and significance of family, motherhood and personal relationships; changes in women's education and shifts in female employment; women's involvement in political and social movements; women's relationship to the state; expressions and regulations of female sexuality; and women and popular culture.

HIST 37500 satisfies the humanities requirement in the university core curriculum and the gender/social diversity requirement in the CLA core curriculum. It is open to all undergraduates.
