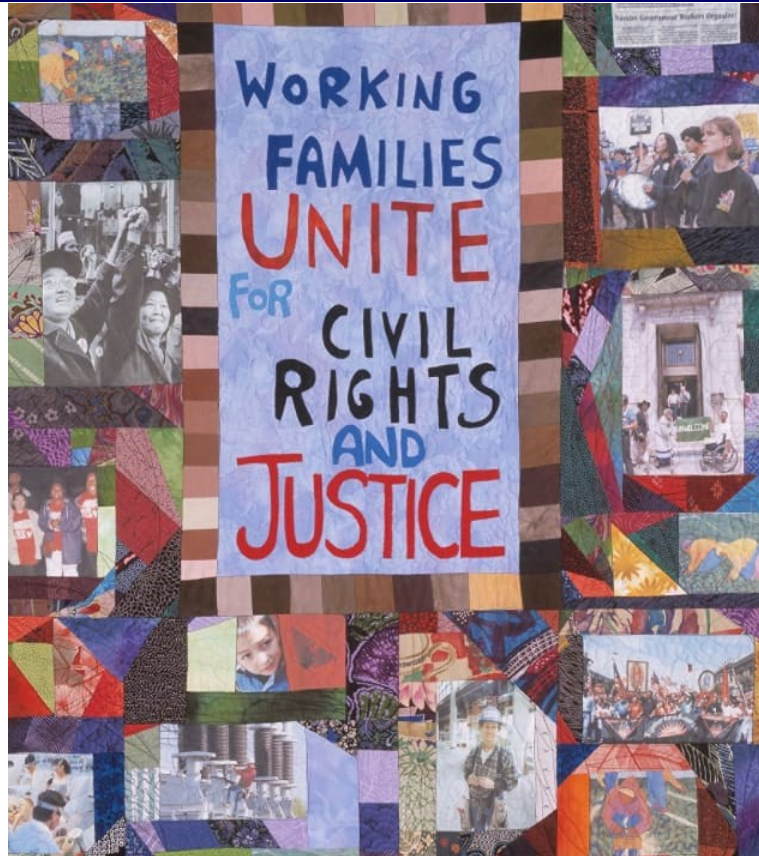

In this course students will practice the methods of historical research and writing by exploring protest movements in modern America. Postwar America was the catalyst for a host of protest movements across the political spectrum from conservative to liberal to radical. We will examine the great variety of protest movements and explore the politics and culture of dissent through diverse primary sources such as magazines and newspapers, movies and music, memoirs and fiction, political speeches and court decisions, television and advertisements, oral histories and photographs, posters and buttons. Students will write a research paper on a topic of their own choosing and based on their own work in these kinds of original sources.
