# Tips and Hints for a Successful Self-Submission Audition

Below are a couple of resources for students looking to produce a self-tape for upcoming auditions.

## Recording

For your tape, consider the following best practices:

- Use a blank background
- Have confidence in material
- Set up a steady camera for a clean take free of extraneous noise/distraction
- Set the camera at EYE level (iPhone and Androids work great)
- Use natural light where possible for a well-lit face
- Follow the specifications of the audition announcement details when they become available
- Use a computer or a phone to upload and send the video file.

#### Editing

To make basic edits (trimming the top and tail of your video), try using iMovie or Windows Video Editor.

### Uploading

Upload your clips to YouTube, Vimeo (<u>https://vimeo.com/upload</u>), or GoogleDrive. MAKE SURE YOUR VIDEO SETTINGS ARE SET TO PRIVATE – use a private YouTube account, set your Vimeo link to a "Private" (this even comes with a password), or use GoogleDrive to privately invite someone to view the link.

### Submitting

Submit your video link via the online audition form <u>here</u> or copy this link into your browser: <u>https://bit.ly/2RZ7HIN</u>. If you have difficulty with permissions on the form access, login to your Purdue email via office.com using your regular email login/password in a separate browser tab.

### Resources
