I reread the "chair's note" from my first year two years ago; it focused on the idea of newness as I embraced all that being a first-time Chair meant. Two years later, newness is again the watchword of the moment as the Department embraces some fairly significant, impactful, and exciting changes!

After three years of planning, and anticipation, I am thrilled to share that we have joined forces with our

colleagues in the former Division of Dance to become the Department of Theatre and Dance! We have a long history of collaboration with Dance: Theatre students have composed original music, designed lights, and stage managed for the Winter and Spring Dance Works concerts since well before I started here in 2004. Coming together as one unit is an exciting evolution of the connections that have always been there, and I can't express how excited I am to see it happening.

We are trying some new things on stage this year, too. Continuing our tradition of bringing more contemporary plays by women playwrights and playwrights of color, we open our season with Sarah Ruhl's *Dead Man's Cell Phone* and close it with Branden Jacobs-Jenkins's *Gloria*, both in the Mallett Theatre. With *Mary Shelley Presents: Frankenstein*, a brandnew, Purdue adaptation of the classic novel, we explore what it means to create and participate in an experiential, theatrical exploration of story and form. And our presentation of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* will feature our graduate acting cohort in their terminal projects in a way you may not have seen before, as they explore both unexpected casting and participating in the directorial process.

Innovation and exploration is embedded deeply in our DNA. The students you will see today (and some you won't see, whose work has made this experience possible) are practicing their craft, applying new skills, and exploring new modalities and forms. This is risky: both for them, and for you because you won't always know what you will get! I am thankful that you have chosen to share your time with us, to be such an integral part of this exploration. We couldn't do it without you.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

It feels a little strange writing a "director's note" for this show, as it has been an ensemble work, from start to finish, by design. While this idea seems very new, it is historically based, and accurate to the period. Shakespeare didn't have directors—the actors helped each other find what works—and that is what we have done here. Ultimately, it means that the characters, the beautiful a Capella songs, and most of the funny bits you see here today are not my work at all, but those of the students you are watching!

I also had the help of an incredible team behind the scenes. This production is the terminal project for our current group of MFA Acting students, and they are serving as both actors in the show, and as my assistant directors. This is the first time we've tried anything quite like this, and from my point of view, it has been a roaring success.

Midsummer is one of Shakespeare's best-known and most-beloved comedies, but we wanted to bring a fresh perspective to it, while remaining true to the text. And so, we cordially welcome you to Midsummer Fest, a modern music festival, sponsored by Athens Corp. This concept worked very easily with Shakespeare's divided world: the powerful lords in Athens, the "rude mechanicals" working in the city, the lovers trying to escape the control of their parents, and the fairies showing the power and magic of the natural world. By setting our Midsummer at a music festival, we were also able to send a little more love to the many people who you rarely see—the designers, technicians, and staff who bring shows like this to life. You'll note that our Mechanicals are all based on backstage jobs, from costumes to security. If they happen to resemble people you know, so much the better!

The main question I posed to the cast is "What is love?" In a show that deals with many kinds of love, from friendship to romance, and from arranged marriages to a spoof of Romeo and Juliet, they each found their own answer, and we hope you find yours. After all, in a world that can often seem dark and bleak, it is the people we love who bring us back to the light.
