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OBJECTIVES—After surveying the philosophy, evolution, structure, function, content, and varieties of human cognition and meaning-making, this course focuses on: (1) the role of language and languaging (speech, sign) in all socio-cultural research; and (2) the types of research on and with language and languages and languaging (speech, sign), and linguistics, as these are realized in, and realizing, culture, society, cognition. Emphasis is given to the nature and uses of classification in general, on universal patterns evident in language, in languaging, on translation and translatability, and on the nondeterminate properties of emergence in dynamical systems generally.O

APPROACHES OF 'HYBRID' LINGUISTICS and CONTEMPORARY ISSUES, INCLUDING: Ontogeny and phylogeny of language and speech; Space and time, continuity and change, markedness and emergence; Socioculturolinguistic construction of 'reality', 'subjectivity', 'objectivity', and 'power'; Orality and literacy, hegemonic structures and functions; Relativity and universality in language, culture, and cognition; Semiotic considerations of induction, deduction, and abduction.
