CLCS 23010 Survey of Greek Literature in Translation — D. Conner

An introduction to Ancient Greek literature from Homer to Plato. All readings in English.

CLCS 23300-001 Comparative Mythology — C. Campbell

Comparative study of the myths of major ancient cultures, with emphasis on shared typological features.

CLCS 23300-002 Comparative Mythology ONLINE — K. Dickson

Comparative study of the myths of major ancient cultures, with emphasis on shared typological features.

CLCS 23700 Gender & Sexuality in Greek & Roman Antiquity — E. Moodie

How identities based on gender, sexual behavior and sexual desire, and socio-economic status are established in ancient Greece and Rome. Exploration of why these ancient views of gender and sexuality remain of continuing importance in the 21st century. All readings in English.

CLCS 38100 (2 sections) Julius Caesar: Statesman, Soldier, Citizen — N. Rauh

The course examines the career of Julius Caesar by focusing on events from Caesar's birth (100 BCE) through his assassination in 44 BCE. The course places Caesar's complex personality within the context of political, military, economic, social, and cultural upheaval during the Late Roman Republic.

CLCS 38700 Roman Religion ONLINE — K. Dickson

Study of the religious beliefs and practices of ancient Rome, based on written, artistic, and archaeological evidence of their forms and functions.

GREK 10200 Ancient Greek Level 2 — E. Mercier

Continuation of the study of Attic Greek grammar and reading of connected prose of the Classical period.

GREK 20200 Ancient Greek Level 4 — E. Mercier

Upper intermediate reading course in ancient Greek, designed to consolidate students' knowledge of grammar and syntax, broaden vocabulary, and develop precision and confidence in reading and translation.

LATN 10200 (2 sections) Latin Level 2 — D. Conner and E. Mercier

Second semester introduction to Latin. Focus on grammar, syntax, vocabulary, and elementary readings in classical Latin and the language of the Vulgate.

LATN 20200 Latin Level 4 — E. Moodie

Upper intermediate reading course in Latin prose and poetry, designed to consolidate students' grasp of grammar and syntax, broaden vocabulary, and develop precision and confidence in reading and translation. We will read portions of Sallust's *Bellum Catilinae*.

LATN 44600 Roman Historians — E. Moodie

Readings and discussion of Roman historical texts: Sallust's *Bellum Catilinae* and Livy's *Ab Urbe Condita*.
