### ITAL 102: Beginning Italian II Meets MWF

Learn how to: talk about body, housing, chores, transportation, vacationing, errands, and city spaces; interact in medical situations; look for an apartment to rent; buy transportation tickets and plan a vacation; navigate the city and its landmarks Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in the medical field; in housing and living arrangements; in vacationing situations; in tourist behaviors



### ITAL 202: Intermediate Italian II Meets MWF

Learn how to: use a more advanced and sophisticated vocabulary to discuss current trends, problems, and solutions in the fields of politics, laws and human rights, religion, immigration, science research, technology, digital environment and culture

Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in approaching social, political, intercultural, and scientific challenges of our age

# FEATURES OF ITALIAN PROGRAM

- ➤ Beginning Italian courses (ITAL 101 and ITAL 102) meet three times per week (MWF) rather than four times per week.
- The Intermediate and Advanced courses continue to meet three times per week (MWF).
- > The amount of grammatical structures covered per semester is reduced in order to have more time to focus on practicing communication in everyday real-life situations.
- Including a more deliberate and consistent intercultural perspective to all our courses (in collaboration with experts from CILMAR), thus equipping our students with intercultural competence, a skill that is invaluable in today's global job market.
- Continuing to offer opportunities for student involvement in extracurricular activities and community building: fun, handson, social and cultural events such as "culture through food" culinary demonstrations, film screenings, card tournaments, and more.

# ITAL 112, 212, 312: Conversation Course Meet MW

1-credit hour course that meets <u>once per week</u>; no tests, homework, or exams; building **conversation skills** at different levels of competence

# ITAL 105: Accelerated Beginning Italian ITAL 101 + 102 = ITAL 105 Meets MWF

Accelerated 6-credit hour course that covers 2-smester materials in 1 semester

Designed for students with some prior knowledge of Italian, students who have taken placement exam, students who speak another foreign language or have studied Latin

Ideal for students who wish to embark on the fast track to minor or major in Italian, GEARE and Degree + students, or graduate students with a language requirement

In special circumstances it may substitute for ITAL 102 if it does not fit student's schedule.

# ITAL 301 and ITAL 302: Advanced Conversation and Composition I & II Meets MWF

Both courses are required for a minor or a major in Italian Using authentic audio, visual, and print sources, students learn how to: <u>discuss</u> various aspects of Italian culture, reflected in its geography, art, history, music, literature, cuisine, and social relations; <u>understand</u> current cultural, social, and political issues such as the changing gender relations, immigration, and technology; <u>critically analyze</u> authentic written, audio, and video materials; <u>critically compare</u> Italian culture to their own

Discover, compare & bridge: focus on intercultural empathy and verbal and non-verbal communication, learning about more complex cultural differences by understanding how surface aspects of culture are related to hidden dimensions of culture (values, beliefs, attitudes etc.)
