ITAL 101: Beginning Italian I Meets MWF

Learn how to: introduce yourself and your family; meet other people; talk about your studies, daily life, weather, fashion, pastimes and sports; order food; interact in shopping situations
 Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in personal space; in family relations; in sport culture and fan behavior; in dining, cooking, and shopping habits



ITAL 102: Beginning Italian II Meets MWF

Learn how to: talk about body, housing, chores, transportation, vacationing, errands, and city spaces; interact in medical situations; look for an apartment to rent; buy transportation tickets and plan a vacation; navigate the city and its landmarks
 Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in the medical field; in housing and living arrangements; in vacationing situations; in tourist behaviors



ITAL 201: Intermediate Italian I Meets MWF

Learn how to: talk about your preferences in arts, movies, music, literature, and press; talk about your future profession; interact in the work environment; write a cover letter and a CV in Italian; talk about nature and environment, and express opinions on environmental problems
 Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in artistic preferences; in professional etiquette and work field; in approaches to environmental problems



ITAL 202: Intermediate Italian II Meets MWF

Learn how to: use a more advanced and sophisticated vocabulary to discuss current trends, problems, and solutions in the fields of politics, laws and human rights, religion, immigration, science research, technology, digital environment and culture
 Discover, compare & bridge: cultural differences in approaching social, political, intercultural, and scientific challenges of our age

FEATURES OF ITALIAN PROGRAM

- All Italian courses (beginning, intermediate, and advanced) meet **three times per week (MWF)**
- Less grammatical structures covered per semester → focus on **practicing communication in everyday real-life situations.**
- **Intentional and systematic intercultural perspective included in all courses** (in collaboration with experts from CILMAR) → equipping students with intercultural competence, an invaluable skill in today's global job market:
 - ✓ ITAL 100-levels: curiosity & openness
 - ✓ ITAL 200-levels: self-awareness & worldview frameworks
 - ✓ ITAL 300-levels: empathy & verbal and nonverbal communication
- Continuing to offer **opportunities for student involvement in extra-curricular activities and community building:** fun, hands-on, social and cultural events such as “culture through food” culinary demonstrations, film screenings, card tournaments, and more.

ITAL 112, 212, 312: Conversation Course Meets MW at 10:30 and 1:30

1-credit hour course that meets once per week; no tests, homework, or exams; building **conversation skills** at different levels of competence



ITAL 205: Accelerated Intermediate Italian ITAL 201 + 202 = ITAL 205
Meets **MWF**

Accelerated 6-credit hour course that covers 2-semester materials in 1 semester

Designed for students with prior knowledge of Italian, students who have taken placement exam, students who completed ITAL 105

Ideal for students who wish to continue on the fast track to minor or major in Italian or graduate students with a language requirement

In special circumstances it may substitute ITAL 202 if it does not fit student's schedule

ITAL 301 and ITAL 302: Advanced Conversation and Composition I & II
Meets **MWF**

Both courses are required for a minor or a major in Italian

Using authentic audio, visual, and print sources, students learn how to: discuss various aspects of Italian culture, reflected in its geography, art, history, music, literature, cuisine, and social relations; understand current cultural, social, and political issues such as the changing gender relations, immigration, and technology; critically analyze authentic written, audio, and video materials; critically compare Italian culture to their own

Discover, compare & bridge: focus on intercultural empathy and verbal and non-verbal communication, learning about more complex cultural differences by understanding how surface aspects of culture are related to hidden dimensions of culture (values, beliefs, attitudes etc.)
