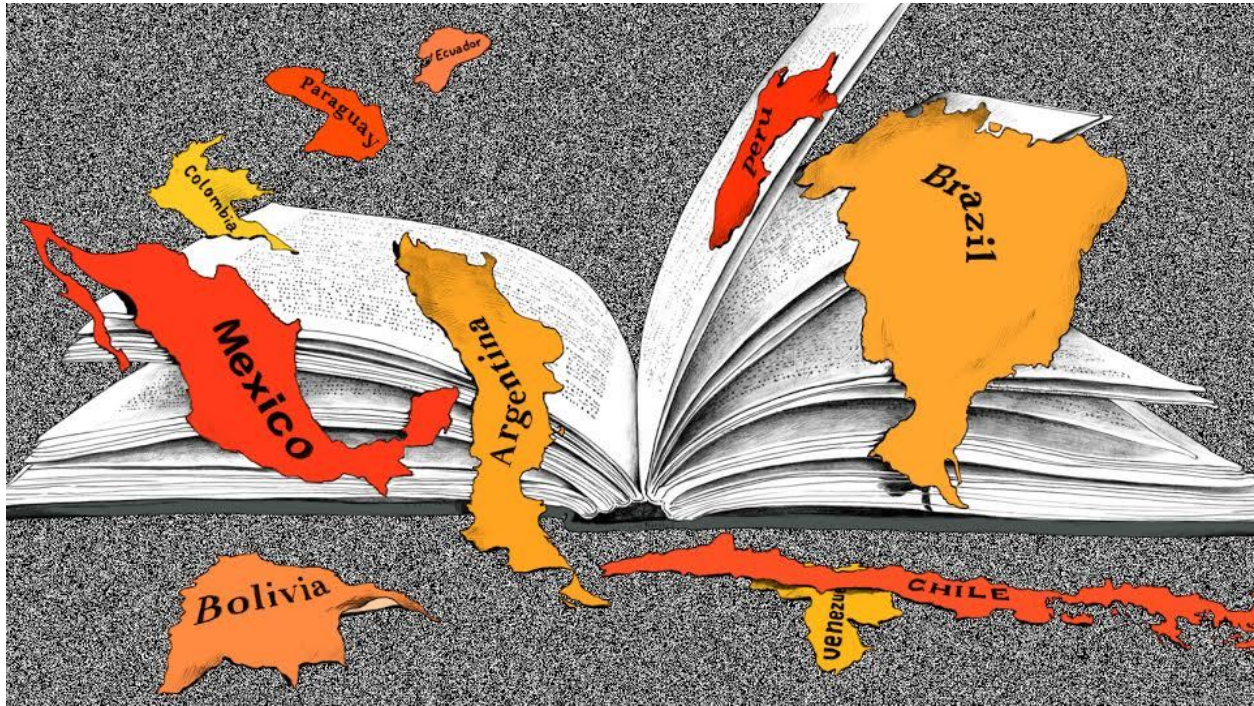

Spanish American Literature in Translation



This course will provide an introduction to major Latin American literary movements and masterpieces in Latin American and U.S. Latino/a literature (all in English translation), while also exposing students to the literary and cultural context in which these works were written. We will examine selected “great works” by Latin American and U.S. Latino/a writers, including world-famous writers such as Isabel Allende, Jorge Luis Borges, Nobel Prize winner Gabriel García Márquez, and Pulitzer Prize winner Junot Díaz, whose novel, *The Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao*, is one of the most highly acclaimed novels of the twenty-first century. Knowledge of Spanish is not required. Class will be conducted in English.
