


KUDOS TO THESE SLC RESEARCHERS ON THEIR ACHIEVEMENTS!



The <u>NEH Humanities Connections Implementation Grant</u> of \$150,000 was awarded to project P.I. **Lori Czerwionka** and her project team in April 2023, following the \$35,000 NEH Humanities Connection Planning Grant that the group had received in 2020.

The team, which includes **Elena Coda**, **Gabriel Ríos-Rojas**, and **Jen William** from SLC, along with **Kirsten Davis** from Engineering Education and **Joe Tort** from the Office of Professional Practice and GEARE, is currently refining and implementing several research and curricular initiatives that work toward the integration of a humanities perspective into engineering coursework and experiential learning.



The group is excited to start working with us on various projects to further enhance our students' experiences while at Purdue and beyond; to increase the visibility of SLC's research, teaching, and community engagement; and to help us actively promote the study of languages and cultures.

Contemporary Chinese Scrolls, originally a gift to Purdue's 11th President, Dr. France A. Córdova, arrived in SLC from Westwood this summer and are now beautifully displayed in our Staaks Lounge. They depict the Classical Chinese literary artistic motifs of the "Four Gentlemen" through the images of the plum blossom, the orchid, the bamboo, and the chrysanthemum; each represents a season of the year and together they symbolize the noble qualities of the traditional Chinese scholar.


CURRICULAR AND EXTRACURRICULAR INNOVATION

IN MEMORIAM




SLC extends its deep and heartfelt condolences to the friends and family of our recently deceased colleagues.

<u>Dr. Robert ("Bob") Hammond</u> passed away in May this year. Bob was on the faculty in Spanish Linguistics from 1988 until his retirement in 2012. Bob's academic specializations included Cuban Spanish Dialectology and he mentored many undergraduate and graduate students concentrating on this field as well as other areas of study.

SLC alumnus <u>Dr. José Newton de Seixas Pereira Filho</u> (PhD, Spanish and Portuguese, 2008) passed away in April this year in Brazil, where he had resided after graduating from Purdue. José was a Professor and Head of the Germanic Department at the Federal University of Southern Bahia.

Alumna and Lecturer <u>Erika Gautschi</u> passed away in March this year. Erika received her MA from the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures in the early 1980's and then became a Lecturer in the department, where she taught German courses for many years. After her retirement from Purdue, she remained active as a tutor and translator.
