

Information for students taking the Italian Placement Test

A “successful passing grade” in a course is defined by ITAL as at least a C-.

Credit after placement test: no immediate credits is awarded upon completion of the placement test as well as or for previous levels until the level placed into is successfully completed

Examples:

- if a student places into ITAL 102, no credits are immediately awarded. The student must take the course for a passing letter grade; the student will then be awarded 6 credits (3 for the ITAL 102 and 3 for the ITAL 101).
- if a student places into ITAL 201 or higher, once students take the level placed into for a passing letter grade, the advisor must contact SLC to apply for dept. credit for the previous course credit.

A student who places into 101 is strongly encouraged to instead register for the accelerated sequence of ITAL 105 and ITAL 205 because they will have had prior Italian courses either in high school or elsewhere. ITAL 101 is reserved for students who have never had Italian previously.

Each language level is worth 3 credits.
