TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIPS

A limited number of teaching assistantships are available for qualified applicants pursuing the Master of Fine Arts and Master of Arts (Art Education only) in the Department of Art and Design. Graduate teaching assistants receive:

- * a full-tuition waiver
- * a competitive stipend
- * an excellent medical benefits package (if 1/2-time)
- * spouses are eligible for in-state tuition

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree and must meet all Graduate School admission requirements.

Those applying for a teaching assistantship should provide an additional 10 images demonstrating a specific strength in the area(s) where they feel most qualified to teach. Upload as "Miscellaneous Supporting Documents" in online application system.

A&D 591 Practicum for A&D Teaching Assistants

Applicants who are awarded a half-time teaching assistantship teach two classes each semester. Teaching assistants have full responsibility for their classes but work closely with a faculty coordinator. Teaching Assistants are required to register for A&D 591 Practicum for Teaching Art & Design each semester they teach. A&D 591 is a seminar course designed to train new and continuing A&D TA's in the content, policies, and format of the courses they teach. Topics include problem/project presentation, critique techniques, grading and discipline. Subsequent semesters focus on improving and refining teaching skills.

Test score requirements for applicants from non-english speaking countries.

Applicants whose scores are lower than the minimum will NOT be considered for a TA. Test scores must not be over two years old. Submit an original copy of test scores to the Director of Graduates Studies, Department of Art and Design, along with the teaching assistantship application form.
