Liberal Arts Core II: Social Diversity	1 course from the Diversity Selective List	Click here for a list of approved courses
Liberal Arts Core III: Linguistic Diversity	Proficiency through Level IV in <u>one</u> world language	

Double counting of courses is allowed across the various categories.

All accredited programs whose accreditation is threatened by CLA Core requirements, both professional BAs and BFAs, are exempt from Liberal Arts Core I & II, in order to meet accreditation standards and requirements – EXCEPT for Liberal Arts Core III: Linguistic Diversity, which is still required.

"Degree +" students (students with a second major outside of Liberal Arts) are exempt from the CLA Core.
